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Introduction:

The Chinatown Community Foundation (CCF) established the "Educational Scholarship & Teacher Grant Program" to support the education of individuals and educators in our local community. The awards are as follows:

- Two (2) Educational Scholarship Awards \$1,000/award
- Two (2) Teacher/School Grant Awards \$500/award

Educational Scholarship Award: The money will be paid directly to the accredited post-secondary academic entity, including trade school, technical college, graduate school, college, or university of the awardee's choice during matriculation.

This scholarship's high school/college year extends through the calendar year of 2023 and consists of two continuous semesters. One semester may be from high school and the other from college. The applicant must submit a school transcript(s), including a list of courses taken, a letter or numerical grade for each course, and their overall grade point average (GPA). The degree of difficulty of each course will be considered. A high or even the highest GPA may not ensure scholarship selection. The applicant must also include a personal letter describing extra-curricular activities and community/chamber involvement. The applicant must answer the following questions in their personal letter:

- 1. Describe the nature and extent of your involvement in the Chinese and Hawaii communities.
- 2. Describe any of your other extracurricular activities, academic honors, awards, & etc.

The application period for the Educational Scholarship Award will be from <u>September 01</u>, <u>2024</u>, <u>to November 08</u>, <u>2024</u>. The completed application must be submitted in its entirety by <u>November 08</u>, <u>2024</u>. All documents should be submitted in PDF format via email to tge@chinesechamber.com no later than the end of the business day (4:00 pm).

Only high school, post-secondary, and college students may apply.

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Teacher/School Grant Award: The money will be paid directly to the school or institution of the awardee for the awardee's use in accordance with their grant application. The applicant must be currently employed as a teacher at a public school, public charter school, charter school, or private school in the State of Hawai'i.

The purpose of this grant is to support teachers and students by offsetting the financial burden of the applicant's initiative/project. The applicant will submit a demographic profile of their students and school community. Additionally, the applicant will describe how they intend to use the grant to support learning in their classroom/school. Consideration will be given based on the following:

- Innovation
- Impact
- Demographic Profile
- Initiative/Project complexity

The applicant must have the endorsement of their supervisor or school administrator.

Once the awardee has implemented their initiative/project, brief documentation (short narrative with pictures) must be submitted as evidence of how the grant funds were used and how the grant positively impacted the students' learning.

The Teacher/School Grant Award application period will be from <u>September 01, 2024, to November 08, 2024</u>. The completed application must be submitted in its entirety by <u>November 08, 2024</u>. All documents should be submitted in PDF format via email to <u>tge@chinesechamber.com</u> no later than the end of the business day (4:00 pm).

The Educational Scholarship and Teacher Grant Program committee reserves the right to schedule an interview with any applicant. The decision of the Committee, with confirmation of the Board, will be the final decision. There will be no appeal process, as the decision will be final upon Board confirmation.
